- 10/18 Chamber Halloween Block Party in Irvington; taking place at the OCA parking lot by the Main Street School. Businesses will set up tables; will include a beer garden, food, costume contests, and theater performances by Rivertowns Payhouse (Rain date 10/19 from 5-7pm);
- 12/14 Chamber Holiday Trolley Ardsley not currently slated to participate due to funding. If that doesn't change, Ardsley Chamber members are able to pop up in another village
 - Logistically difficult to get to Ardsley
 - Cost of trolley is an issue
 - Will reconsider Ardsley participation due to an increase in new Ardsley Chamber membership; possibility of focusing on downtown area only instead of all of Ardshaverhilley; Needs to be decided ASAP, especially because Tarrytown and Sleepy Hollow are having their events on the same day.

Village Update:

- Expanding Bridge Street parking lot from 26 spaces to 52 or 54; Will update lighting, signage, etc.; Board extended no-fee parking until end of year
- Grants for Addyman Square revitalization
- Looking at crossing issue on saw mill river road, which is dangerous
- Another gas station is coming to the village; Traffic studies have already been conducted.
- Approved a teen hangout venue and other teen-based small businesses
- Chamber requested Village share info on new businesses so that the Chamber can properly welcome them to the business community and introduce them to the work of the Chamber.
- Old Riviera building is still on sale.
- Pedestrian improvement Village met last month with consultant engineers to improve safety on Center Street and Route 9A. Recommendation is to amend the road from 3 lanes to 2 lanes; adding a crosswalk at Haverhill intersection to cross 9a to V.W.Macy Park's south entrance; Will draft recommendation to DOT this month for their review
- Open grant application for pump, for storm water
- Grant from federal government to redesign and improve Addyman Square.
- Public Arts Commission created last week for Village (3 members thus far). Please keep Chamber informed.
- Sophia Johnson, political economist, was offered volunteer opportunity with village to speak at one of the Trustee work sessions
- Mark Crosskey may host a classroom chamber series session on sustainability; Offered the village and businesses help to lower energy bills and heating/cooling
